





It is a beautiful country in the heart of Europe. Poland lies in the centre of Europe where the West meets the East. Our country is inhabited by as many as 38.5 million people, which makes us the sixth largest country in the European Union in terms of population. We border Germany, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Ukraine, Belarus, Russia and Lithuania. In addition, we can boast of beautiful landscapes: the vast Baltic Sea, the majestic Tatra Mountains, the Bieszczady Mountains with their wildlife and the Białowieża Forest, which is included in the prestigious UNESCO list.

Poles are hospitable

This is not a myth, Poles are really hospitable.

Don't be surprised if your new colleague offers to show you the best attractions in town and then invites you to dinner with friends or family. It is worth pointing out that lunch usually consists of two dishes, which are often followed by a dessert. You'll soon see that your new friends will do their best to make you feel at home here. Don't be afraid to ask for help when you need it. Polish people speak English very well as shown by the largest international proficiency ranking carried out by the EF Proficiency Index (EF EPI) and published in 2020.* Poland is ranked 16th out of 100 countries around the world whose inhabitants are fluent in English.

Don't be scared, it's safe with us

Do you know that out of 163 countries around the world, Poland is 29th in the ranking evaluating security, peace and stability? Such data stems from the analysis of the independent Institute of Economics and Peace, conducted in 2019. Interestingly, Poland's position has improved by three places compared to 2018. Our country is therefore a safer place than the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Spain or Greece.

You can count on student discounts

In Poland, we greatly appreciate the fact that someone wants to develop and study. In our country, students can expect a 50% discount on public transport, i.e. trams and buses. It should also be pointed out that such a large discount also applies to trains travelling all over Poland. This allows you to sightsee and travel much cheaper while studying. Remember that as a student you also spend less on tickets to the cinema or theatre. Many pubs and restaurants also offer special prices for students. If you want to take advantage of the discounts you are entitled to, remember to always have your student card with you. We will issue it to you after you have submitted a set of admissions documents, at the beginning of the academic year.

The cost of living is not high

The cost of living depends on your needs and lifestyle, but compared to other European countries such as France or Germany, you will simply find it easier to live in Poland. The prices of services and products vary depending on which city you live in. The average cost of living for a foreign student in Wrocław can be between €350 and €550.

It is not difficult to get a job

You will soon move out of your parents' house and start studying. Taking up a job can help you adapt to your new realities. Finding a job in Poland, where the unemployment rate is low at 6.2% (October 2020), is not very difficult. Remember that if you come from an EU and EEA country, you do not have to apply for a work permit. If you come from a country outside the EU, you will need a student visa or a temporary work permit.

More and more people from abroad are studying here

Poland is a country more frequently chosen by young people from abroad. They decide to study here because of many reasons, which have been described above.*
In the academic year 2019/20 - the last one before the pandemic hit - Polish universities were chosen by almost 83 thousand students from abroad. This is an impressive result, taking into consideration that in 2005 there were only 8 thousand of them. Whereas in 2018, 78 000 foreign students from 174 countries went to study in Poland.


Wrocław - the ideal student city for you

A city bustling with student life

Wrocław is one of the most important academic centres in Poland. It is located in Lower Silesia, where nearly 118 thousand students study. Year by year, Wrocław is attracting more and more young people from abroad, including Ukraine, Turkey, India, Ghana, Angola and Nigeria. The local universities entice them not only with their high level of education but also with a prospect of a crazy student life in a modern city full of music and art. As expected, students have a great deal of fun here every year during the annual students' event organized by almost all universities.

Excellent career prospects

By choosing to study in Wrocław, many young people think about staying here after they graduate. No wonder - the city is developing at a fast pace, especially in the IT sector, and therefore is sometimes called the Polish Silicon Valley. In 2019, 110 large IT centres employed as many as 36 000 people. Thanks to the modern information technology industry in Wrocław, employment and the level of salaries of employees is systematically increasing. The most important corporations include: Google, IMB or HP.





The ideal place to live

The capital of Lower Silesia is a place where you not only study well but also live. In 2019 Wrocław was included in the Quality of Living 2019 ranking - the quality of life survey carried out by Mercer. Wrocław took 2nd place among Polish cities, just after Warsaw, and was ranked 100th among 231 cities in the world.

Comfortable and trouble-free transport

You can reach Wrocław from your place of residence by the safest means of transport, that is by plane. The airport is only 10 km from the city centre. Moving around Wrocław will not be a problem for you. Apart from hiking, you can choose from: modern city buses and trams, ecological Wrocław City Bike or electric scooters





Wrocław is a meeting place. It offers a unique atmosphere fostering international and intercultural projects and events. Brave Festival, Guinness Guitar Record, International Festival of Street Artists "BuskerBus" are one of them.

The abundance of cultures

For decades Wrocław has been home to many nationalities. It is possible that such experiences have resulted in its openness.

The symbol of the city's diversity and its religious tolerance is the District of Four Denominations, located near the Market Square. It fully reflects the character of Wrocław, where people of many nationalities, religions and cultures live in the past and today. Initiatives such as the Multicultural Wrocław, Wrocław Migrant or the Wrocław Centre for Social Development ensure that every inhabitant, regardless of their origin, feels good here.

Unique atmosphere

It is not without reason that Wroclaw is referred to as the Polish Venice or Venice of the North - there are many islands, bridges and footbridges here. The city lies on the Oder River, on 12 islands and boasts about over 100 bridges. When strolling over through one of them, it is worth looking at the surface of the river, which reflects picturesque green landscapes, or beautiful tenement houses remembering a distant history. Besides, while wandering around Wrocław, keep your eyes wide open so as not to miss the dwarves! One of them lives in WSB, his name is Fuger and you will meet him at the entrance to building A.

Wrocław never falls asleep. Especially on so-called "student Thursdays" students can benefit from discounts in bars. The Rynek and Pasaż Niepolda are the two most popular party venues. You will find several dozen clubs, pubs and restaurants here.



The capital of entertainment

This is a city full of entertainment and it is impossible to get bored here. During the daytime, cinemas, theatres, museums, the Wrocław Opera House, the National Forum of Music, the ZOO, the African Centre, as well as a viewing terrace in the Sky Tower, the tallest building in Poland, from where you can admire a breath-taking panorama of the city. When walking, be sure to see the historic part of Wrocław, Ostrów Tumski. We guarantee that you will fall in love with this atmospheric place. In spring, however, be sure to visit the Botanical Garden and the Japanese Garden. Do not forget to see the Wrocław Multimedia Fountain, the largest fountain in Poland. At night, during the summer season, spectacular shows are held here to the rhythm of music.

Our campus - study in comfortable conditions

We understand the importance of your choice, and we hope that the information you find on the following pages will make it much easier for you. In the WSB in Wrocław we create conditions for studying, making friends, meeting people who can become mentors and authority. Our lecturers treat you as a partner because it is the only way to inspire you with passion. We also make sure that you simply study well and comfortably with us. This means that you learn in a comfortable campus using modern technology. We have adapted all facilities on the campus to the needs of people with disabilities.

Our campus consists of 5 modern buildings (the latest one was opened in autumn 2020), located in Fabryczna Street, near Wrocław Industrial Park, Wroclaw Business Park and Wroclaw Technology Park. More than 25.000 people come to this part of the city to work and study. You will not find another place like that in Wrocław, the permeation of many initiatives and activities.

The newest building on campus is at the same time one of the most modern academic buildings among universities in Lower Silesia.

On the area of 8300 m² there are 58 training rooms which can accommodate over 2000 students, as well as 12 laboratories and 4 lecture rooms. It does not lack any facilities such as a restaurant, coffee kiosk, copying facilities, relaxation zones and a drinking water spring. The area around the building has been developed with a greenery and benches so that you can relax in between classes in a pleasant environment.

Moreover, at university:

- you receive a free email account and can use, among others,
 Microsoft Office 365 the whole Office package and cloud services,
- you participate in lectures and exercises that take place in comfortable and well equipped rooms,
- you can borrow books and magazines or use them on site in the reading room,
- you will make a copy of the notes at the photocopying facilities on the university premises,
- you will connect to a Wi-Fi network,
- you will use computer and specialist laboratories, e.g. RFID, CISCO, SAP Next-Gen, MAC, Lab Powered by Nokia,
- you can buy a sandwich or lunch in between classes at one of the catering facilities on the university campus,
- you will rest in specially arranged student zones and on warmer days
- in the green part of our campus.

If you are going to get to the university by car, you do not have to worry about the availability of parking spaces - we have prepared as many as 100 of them. In addition, the building is accessible from the renovated Fabryczna Street, which facilitates access by car and public transport. What is more, due to the citu's investment and the construction of a bus and tram route, in the near future (2023) it will take you less than 20 minutes to get to the university from the city centre.

The library and the reading room

Our library is a quiet and peaceful place. It is contrasted with noisy corridors, crowded halls and it is a pretty good alternative for those looking for a place to focus and study. During your studies at the WSB you will gain access to almost 100.000 books and nearly 80 titles of trade journals, as well as many databases containing, among others, archives of tens of thousands of renowned scientific journals from around the world.



Moreover, our students also have access to electronic resources of books and magazines in English. They are available on such platforms as: Emerald Insight, EBSCO, ELSEVIER, ISI WEB OF KNOWLEDGE, SCOPUS, WILEY, SCIENCE or NATURE.

You can use the library's resources 7 days a week in a time-saving way: you can order books through the electronic booking system and return them (thanks to a special drop-off box located in front of the entrance to the library) even after opening hours. Whether you are just sitting comfortably on the couch in your room or going to the cinema with your friends, you can always be in touch with us. Extranet

Extranet - is an internal system which regardless of where you are (on the couch at home or in the café), will allow you to check:

- the schedule and timetable of classes,
- · grades from the entire study period,
- consultation hours with lecturers and university authorities on duty,
- the rules and regulations that apply to you,
- · information on payments for studies,
- timetable for the session,
- WSB library catalogue.

Thanks to the Extranet you will also have access to other documents and applications you need. We will inform you about how to log in when you become our student.

Get to know the VDI

VDI (Virtual Desktop Infrastructure) is a solution that will enable you to use the full resources of our computer laboratories remotely. This means that you can participate in online lab activities and learn to work in advanced ICT environments. You also use specialist software, according to your chosen field of study.



Electronic student's record book and online assessments

With the electronic student's record book you can check your entries and ratings with a few clicks. You will not have to worry about forgetting your student's record book for the exam because you simply do not need it.



Moodle

This is an e-learning platform that you have access to via the Extranet. Thanks to it you are always in touch with the lecturers and have access to:

- · sample tests for self-study,
- multimedia presentations,
- · websites of interest,
- films and other multimedia materials.

Thanks to the Moodle platform, you will also be able to send your projects and homework to the lecturers, as well as solve the tests necessary to get a final pass in a given course. You can access the materials via your Extranet account.


MS Office 365 - free package for our students

Our students have the opportunity to download the latest version of the Office 2016 office suite free of charge as part of the Microsoft 365 A3 subscription for students. Using MS Office 365, you will be able to take advantage of solutions such as:

- possibility to install the Office package on up to 5 devices (PC or Mac computers, mobile devices with iOS, Android or Windows),

MS leams is one of the best-rated remote communication platforms in the world. It enables students to keep in touch with the lecturer on an ongoing basis, to hold discussions and ask questions, and to work in subgroups on projects with colleagues.



We are flexible - hybrid learning if necessary

Usually it is our lecturers who evaluate the students, but this time in the spring of 2020, during a pandemic, we had to pass the most important exam. We had to face an extremely difficult challenge and adapt very quickly to the new conditions. Almost immediately, we switched to remote learning so that our students could continue their studies, take part in classes and undertake viva voce examinations.

After several months of hard work it turned out that we passed the remote learning exam. As many as 82% of the university students were very happy and satisfied with the actions we took during the current coronavirus pandemic. Such evaluation has motivated us to make even greater efforts. In preparing for the new academic year 2020/2021, we were primarily concerned about the safety of students and lecturers, and the implementation of classes according to the programme. We planned to conduct classes in a mixed model*, also called hybrid. This means that some of the classes were taught in the traditional mode, i.e. within the walls of the university, and some were conducted in a remote mode, i.e. online, most often through the Microsoft Teams platform. When the pandemic intensified, the government decided that we should once again smoothly switch to online teaching.

Scholarships, or how to reduce the cost of studying

You can get a scholarship for good academic performance and active involvement in university life.

- The Rector's Scholarship awarded for good academic performance. Any undergraduate in the second year and a student in the first and second year of the Master's studies can apply for a scholarship. If you are in the third year of your Bachelor's or Engineering studies, this is only possible if you have a Polish Card or a permanent residence permit.
- Sports scholarship after completing your first year of studies, you can also receive a scholarship from the Ministry of Science and Higher Education for good results in sports in international competition and for sports achievements and representing the colours of the university in the academic sports movement.







Which studies to choose?

Each of us has a different lifestyle and preferences. When it comes to studying, you also have the chance to choose the form that suits you best. Do you know the difference between full-time and part-time studies? How do you get a Bachelor's, Engineer's and Master's degree and how do they differ? You can find out about this in this section of the guide.

BA studies

- These are undergraduate studies with a Bachelor's degree, which is also recognised in other countries.
- This is the most popular type of higher education in the WSB.
- These studies last 6 semesters, or 3 years, during which you acquire practical knowledge and valuable professional experience.
- You can apply for jobs requiring higher education and then continue in Masters

Remember that you must have a secondary education to start your studies.

Engineering studies

- These are undergraduate studies leading to an engineering degree.
- These studies last 7 semesters, i.e. 3.5 years, during which you acquire practical knowledge and professional experience.
- The programme's fields of study include knowledge of engineering and technical sciences.
- In your first year of study, you will broaden your knowledge in an additional mathematics repetition course, which we have prepared for the newcomers.
- You can apply for jobs that require a university or higher education in engineering, and continue your studies leading to a Master's degree.

Remember that you must have a secondary education to start your studies.

MA studies

- You can enrol after getting your Bachelor's or Engineer's degree, also earned abroad.
- These studies last 4 semesters, or 2 years, and finish with a viva voce examination to earn a Master's degree.

Full-time studies

A different kind of full-time studies, an obvious choice for people applying for a visa in Poland. In full-time studies you will have classes from Monday to Friday. We try to arrange the timetables so that you can have all mandatory classes 3-4 days a week. This means that not only weekends, but even two weekdays are fully at your disposal. You can spend this time working, studying or relaxing.

Part-time studies

If you choose a part-time study programme, your timetable will be organised on a weekend basis, on average once every fortnight. This means that you can devote your weekdays and every other weekend to your work and personal life. The amount of material to be learned and the study programme do not differ in any way from the programme in part-time studies, the study is simply planned differently.

Regardless of the form of study you choose, you can count on the support of student departments in English. You will also receive access to the individual student's record book Extranet and key messages in English.

Remember!

You can you get a student visa only if you are a full-time student.





You can become a first-cycle student (undergraduate or engineering) at WSB University after graduating from high school and collecting your secondary school completion certificate. Remember that Poland has different modes of validation of high school certificates, depending on the country you graduated from. You can find needed information at the link.

Remember to get a validation of your graduation certificate before leaving for Poland. It is a document that approves the education you have accomplished so far that allows you to enroll in studies in the country you have studied. You can find a template of such a certificate at the link.

You can become a second-cycle (Master's) student at WSB University after completing your first-cycle studies and receiving your diploma. Still, WSB University may ask you to officially validate your international certificate in Poland. For this purpose, you should report to the National Agency for Academic Exchange (NAWA). You can find needed information at the link.
